Our renovation and expansion project is on budget and on schedule for a summer 2021 re-opening to the community. Currently, the construction crew is hard at work inside the Library, painting walls, installing some finishes, preparing for furniture and much more. It is exciting to see the progress. We invite you to visit our website for weekly updates, including pictures and our time-lapse exterior camera. Staff members are preparing to move back to 6th Avenue and working diligently to ensure our services and programs are ready for you in time for summer.

While we remain at our temporary space at Haines, we are doing everything we can to keep staff and patrons safe by disinfecting high traffic areas every two hours, sanitizing equipment, quarantining our materials upon return and implementing strict safety protocols for staff. Those procedures are ready in case we need them in the new building, too. We are ready! In the meantime, we welcome you to visit our temporary space.

Although it has been a challenging year, we are happy to move forward with a new initiative. As a government institution, our Library continues to strive to be as transparent as possible. It is with great enthusiasm that we have rolled out a new transparency tool on our website to provide the community with our statistics in a user-friendly, accessible way. Software from OpenGov.com has enabled us to provide our community access to monthly statistics regarding our collection, circulation, programming, website usage and more. 




