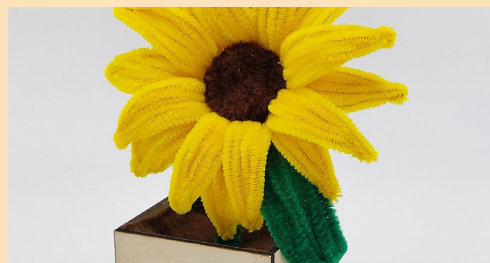

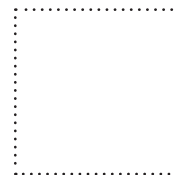

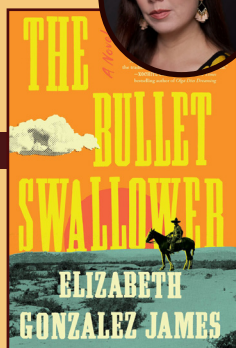
The Bullet Swallower by Elizabeth Gonzalez James
